- ? **Hotel Booking** – Proof of accommodation covering your entire stay.

- ? **Day-to-Day Itinerary** (*Optional but recommended for first-time applicants*) – A well-structured travel plan explaining your stay in Schengen countries.
- ? **Statement of Purpose (Optional)** – A cover letter explaining the reason for your trip, itinerary, and how you will fund your expenses.
- ? **Visa Application Form** – Fully completed and signed, as per the specific Schengen country requirements.

Residency Status:

- As a **UAE resident**, you must provide a copy of your **residence permit or UAE visa**, which must remain **valid for at least three months** beyond your intended return date from the **Schengen Area**.

2. Personal Documents from the Applicant

- ? **No Objection Certificate (NOC)** – A letter from your employer confirming your **job position, salary, and approved leave for travel**.
- ? **Bank Statement (Last 6 Months)** – Must be **stamped by the bank** to verify financial stability. Most Schengen embassies require **a consistent balance of AED 10,000 to AED 20,000** for 7-15 days trip

(or equivalent in other currencies).

? **Trade License (For Business Owners)** – If self-employed, provide a **copy of your UAE trade license**.

Being well-prepared with **authentic and complete documentation** improves your chances of **visa approval** while reducing the risk of delays or rejection.
